Interim Policy on the Use of Portable Electronic Devices (PEDs) in USTRANSCOM Facilities and Areas

Due to security concerns a new policy governing the use of Portable Electronic Devices (PEDs) has been established by US-TRANSCOM. The policy went into affect in January 2008 strictly prohibiting personal cell phones, laptops computers with wireless capability, audio/video recording devices, wireless message devices, personal digital assistants (PDAs) and Blackberries being brought into a USTRANSCOM Facility.

This policy means to most of us that the US-

TRANSCOM and JTRU
Personnel will not be allowed to bring their electronic devices, like cell phones, into the buildings. Even when the device is turned off, this is still considered a security risk.

POSTAL SERVICES OFFERS DISCOUNT SHIPPING

Planning to send a care package to a military service member serving abroad? Take advantage of a new flat-rate box from the Postal Service that is 50 percent larger and delivered for \$10.95 to an APO/FPO address -- \$2 less than for domestic destinations.

The new priority mail large flat-rate box $(12" \times 12" \times 5-1/2")$ will be available in post offices nationwide, but

they can also be ordered at www.usps.com/supplies or by calling 800-610-8734. Some of the new boxes are co-branded with the logo of "America Supports You," which is a Department of Defense program that connects citizens offering support to the military and their families.

The \$2 discount is applied when the priority mail large flat-rate boxes are shipped to

an APO/FPO destination. The two existing flat-rate boxes (11-7/8"x3-3/8"x13-5/8" and 11"x 8-1/2"x5-1/2"), currently retail for \$8.95 for U.S. addresses, are not available for the military discount. All flat-rate boxes can be used for international shipping.

SPACE-A TRAVEL

Military families of deployed personnel may be able to save some travel money thanks to a new Space-A policy. As of December 6, 2007, Spouses and children of personnel deployed 120 days or longer now can use military trans-
